

County 4-H youth paid \$33,000 for livestock

Huerfano County 4-H livestock growers received \$33,093.40 for 70 head of beef, swine, sheep, rabbits and chickens during the annual sale Sunday afternoon in La Veta. 4-H officials said the sale was about average, but with less buyers than usual.

Walsenburg Sand and Gravel paid Krystal Heikes \$2204 for her grand champion beef and Colorado Farm Bureau paid Dena Feese \$1842 for her reserve champion.

Other beef buyers were Sporleder Feeds, Trinidad State Junior College, Lee's Cable TV, Big "R", La Veta Propane, Joe Kirscht, First National Bank in Walsenburg, La Veta Oil, Earl Tatman and Steve Garrett.

April Menegatti received \$464 for her grand champion hog from Grandote Golf and Country Club. La Veta Medical Clinic/Dr. William Cluff, one of the major buyers of the day, purchased the reserve champion from Bob Brown for \$430.50.

Other swine buyers included: Sporleder Feeds, La Veta Propane, Lucille Woodring, Colorado Farm Bureau, Big "R", Paul Morgan Excavating, Ringo's Markets, Huerfano County Farm Bureau and Trinidad State Junior College.

La Veta Medical Clinic/Dr. William Cluff also purchased the

grand champion sheep from Mike Valerio for \$445. Ludvik Propane purchased the reserve champion from Barbie Corsentio for \$320.34.

Sheep purchases were also made by, Front Range Petroleum, Wesley Medill, Alfred Murray, Don and Donna Toller Advertising, Heikes Simmentals, Mary Alice Corsentino/Farm Bureau, Sporleder Feeds, Boies Almont, Duran Construction, Mickey and Malea Schmidt, Arkansas Valley Coop, Big "R", Grandote Golf and Country Club, First National Bank in Walsenburg, Joe Kirscht, La Veta Propane, Spanish Peaks Construction and Huajatolla Land and Cattle Co.

John Menegatti sold his grand champion rabbit for \$385 to La Veta Medical Center/Dr. William Cluff. It was returned to the 4-Her. Story Creek Outfitters did the same for Jody Vargas' reserve champion hare, paying \$75.

Other rabbit buyers were Huajatolla Land and Cattle, Alton Tirey, Cuchara Valley Dairy, Sporleder Feeds and Ludvik Propane.

Jason Menegatti's grand champion chicken sold for \$60 to Frank and Attilio Menegatti. The reserve champion chicken raised by Luke Riggins sold for \$40 to Grandote Golf and Country Club which they returned to the 4-Her.

DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE: Petition filed Aug. 7 by Brenda Kay B. Larrew, La Veta and Todd Alvin Larrew, Manzanola. Couple married July, 1986 in Walsenburg. Petition filed Purnell Allen Rice, Beulah and Judy K. Rice, Security. Couple married September, 1989 in Colorado Springs.

HUGH NILES of Rio Cucharas Estates in Walsenburg, has plead guilty to possession of more than eight ounces of marijuana and sentenced to one year probation by District Judge Claude Appel. In addition to the probationary period, Niles will spend 30 days in Fort Lyons within 60 days of the sentence which was handed down Aug. 8 and perform eight hours of useful public service. Niles also paid court fees of \$267. Niles' wife, Renee, charged in the same case, was fined \$100 earlier after pleading guilty to possession of less than one ounce of marijuana. Her address was given as Navajo Ranch Resorts which was in error. Charges against the couple were originally filed in October, 1990 by Deputy DA Robert Wild.

JURY TRIAL for David Noga, charged with third degree assault, disorderly conduct, resisting arrest and two counts of assault in the second degree, set for Wednesday was vacated by District Judge Jesse Manzanares until Nov. 20. Noga asked for the continuance because he has obtained a new attorney, Sharon Liko of Denver, where Noga has been living. The charges were filed as the result of an incident in the Silver Dollar Bar in Walsenburg in October, 1990. At the same time Judge Manzanares allowed Stella Duran Noga, the defendant's wife, also charged and sentenced in the altercation and represented by Liko, to begin serving the remainder of her 60 day sentence in Huerfano County jail on weekends only. Duran/Noga has 12 days left to serve on her sentence and asked the court that she be released because of her five minor children. She will serve the remainder of the sentence during the next six consecutive weekends.
